



In Pahalgam, we wait to immerse in the tranquility of nature with leisurely strolls along the Lidder River and picnics amidst verdant valleys.



A TERRIBLE KINDNESS

Taking us back to the 1960s, Jo Browning Wroe tells the story of a young man called William, that sees his life changed after volunteering to help at the Aberfan disaster in South Wales. Shaped by PTSD, music, friends and family, William's story is told carefully detailed, taking the reader on a journey that reflects on life in 1960's Britain.

Jo Browning Wroe has an MA in Creative Writing from the University of East Anglia and a BA in English and Education from the University of Cambridge, where she now teaches on their postgraduate certificate in teaching creative writing. Her debut novel, A Terrible Kindness was a Sunday Times bestseller, translated into several languages and shortlisted for the Bridport Peggy Chapman-Andrews award, the RSL Christopher Bland Prize and longlisted for the Prix du Roman Fnac. She has two adult daughters and lives in Cambridge with her husband.

Jo will be in conversation with Raylsi Ballhatchet to share with us what inspired her novel and the writing journey to create A Terrible Kindness.






