





#### INDIAN INFLUENCE ON MALAY TEXTILES

Born in Chicago to Singaporean parents, John earned his Asian Art History degrees from the University of Michigan before establishing a renowned gallery in Taipei, showcasing Asian antiques. In 2014, John's encounter with Malay textiles sparked a collecting passion, leading him across Asia. His move to Malaysia in 2018 was driven by this fervor. Amidst his journey, he ventured into unexpected realms, from meeting the androgynous Bissu priests of the Bugis people to crashing a rural Indonesian royal party. Notably, he met a Khmer Rouge survivor who shared the tale of a cherished textile. His dedication and discoveries, including the acclaimed "Splendors of Malay World Textiles" exhibition, have left an indelible mark, inspiring local designers and encouraging a heartfelt embrace of heritage.

Our talk is going to be on the influence of India and Indian Artisans on Malay textiles, from the Ajrakah in Gujarat to the weavers in Varanasi. While researching Malay textiles, John uncovered some previously unhighlighted intimate connections between Indian and Malay textile traditions. In his upcoming Zoom presentation, he aims to share his findings, with the intent of not only advancing our comprehension of Indian and Malay textiles but also strengthening the cultural ties between the people of these regions.



#### **IWA TRIP TO EGYPT**

"Chalo!" That's Karim, our Egyptologist tour guide encouraging us onwards, upwards and ahead to the next wonder that awaited in the land of sand dunes, sphinxes and shawarma.

Egypt, in a word, was spectacular. Right from the start.

Our first stop was the Temple of Karnak, which is believed to be the exact spot where creation began. We wandered in a daze through the vast complex of temples, pylons and ram-headed sphinxes, marvelling at the sheer massiveness of it all. This sense of scale was a feature that would take our breath away again, the same evening when we visited the Temple of Luxor. But it wasn't just how the enormous statues dwarfed everything around them - equally, we were awed by their serenity and sheer beauty, as well as the attention paid to the smallest detailing of the mysterious hieroglyphics.

Karim assured that we'd be speed-reading hieroglyphics by the end of our tour. Well, not quite, but we did find by the end that more details than we realised had been soaked in. For example, though figures of Gods and God-emperors could look confusingly similar, we knew that a rounded cartouche of hieroglyphics proclaimed the figure to be a king, not a god.

But first, back to Day Two that saw us boarding the Nile cruise ship. This would be our home over the next few days as we sailed along the historic river to visit wonders of the past.

Some of us also floated up, as though through water, the very next morning – our ballooning adventure! Just as the night sky turned from black to rose, a vast empty field came alive with multicoloured balloons being filled with air. Then we soared up over the landscape, taking in the Nile and glimpses of the Valley of the Kings that we would visit later that day.

On board the cruise we had lots of fun, whether eating, chatting and Nile-watching or playing cards and boardgames – including a most appropriate Egyptian board game called Ra. There was dancing, lucky draws, a Galabeya Party (galabeya being the traditional, loose-fitting garment of the Nile Valley), even a leisurely riverine ride on the local sailboat called a felucca.

Along with ever-more spectacular architectural wonders, we began to acquire an ever-increasing vocabulary of Egyptian gods. The stately falcon god, Horus, fixed us with a knowing eye at his marvellously well-preserved Temple at Edfu, while at the Kom Ombo temple, it was the more pointed gaze of the crocodile god, Sobek. Another startling detail here was an engraved wall image of medical instruments for performing surgery such as scalpels and forceps. All those millennia ago...

We missed the Nile when we disembarked and headed to the massive rock-cut temples of Abu Simbel. This entire complex was relocated, stone-by-stone in 1968 to its present site, to avoid being submerged by the Aswan Dam reservoir. We were instantly hypnotised by the gigantic statues of Rameses II, one of the greatest rulers of all antiquity.

And finally, back to Cairo, and its many wonders including the Coptic Churches and the fabulous Mosque of Muhammad Ali that's modelled along the lines of Turkey's Blue Mosque. There was shopping at the bustling Khan el-Khalili bazaar and the cosmopolitan island-district of Zamalek. Cairo offered two amazing Museum visits – the highlight of the Egyptian Museum was King Tutankhamun's treasures while that of the National Museum of Egyptian Civilization was undoubtedly its array of spooky mummies. There was also a day trip to Alexandria, its library and catacombs.

Any flies in the ointment? Well, yes, the heat! It was a palpable energy-sapping presence, even for us from warm Madras. What totally balanced out the heat was the warm camaraderie among all of us – IWA ladies, their friends, spouses and daughters. Apart from singalongs and games and posing merrily for photos, everyone also paid attention to the needs of others. Folks helped out, were scrupulously on time – and shared a seemingly endless stream of goodies from trail mixes to chocolate-dates that filled in the non-meal times between babaganoush and koshari.

Like the tour itself, let's save the best for last, the pyramids of Giza. Those rows upon rows of massive stones that sit in perfect alignment. Consider that 5,000 years on, our carpenters struggle to get a kitchen shelf right.

We went on to the majestic Sphinx and bent double to wiggle our way into a step-pyramid to admire the paintings and hieroglyphics within – what a richly imagined worldview those Egyptians had! Adding masala in our minds were the myths that whirl around pyramids – sadly, though, we cannot report even a Single instance of extra-terrestrial contact. Adding still more masala to the mix was the belly-dancer at our final celebratory dinner, with both the IWA ladies and spouses executing some sensuous shimmies.

You know... I suspect the thirty of us who went on this unforgettable trip to Egypt still stumble out of bed in the morning with "Chalo!" ringing in our ears. Or wishing that it did – and waiting for the next time we can go off on a group adventure!
