**Dr. Sudhanshu Mani** is a distinguished engineer and former apex-grade officer of the Government of India, who retired as General Manager of the Integral Coach Factory, Chennai, after nearly four decades with Indian Railways. He is best known as the visionary leader behind India's first indigenous semi-high-speed train, Train 18—now the Vande Bharat Express. His journey in leading and completing this unique project is recounted in his best-selling book “**My Train 18 Story**”.

Drawing upon his leadership and management experience in Indian Railways—particularly at the Integral Coach Factory, Chennai, and during the Train 18/Vande Bharat project—**Dr. Mani will speak about the importance of empathetic team-building and the courage to realize ambitious dreams.** He will reflect on the true spirit of Atmanirbhar Bharat, the evolving definition of success, and the fine line between pride and vanity. The talk will also explore cultivating a meaningful circle of influence, choosing to be a “**witty fool**” rather than a “**foolish wit,**” and **the enduring idea that while we know what we are, we do not yet know what we may become.**

So fasten your seat belts and join us for an engaging morning of stories, insights and inspiration from the journey of Train 18.



## MAKING A DIFFERENCE TO EVERYDAY LIVES

Almost everyone knows that the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) exists but not many know what it does, much less how it affects their everyday lives. Most people associate the Reserve Bank with the printing and distribution of currency, but its functions extend much beyond that. **The main responsibility of the RBI is to maintain low and steady inflation while supporting growth and employment.**

What the RBI does makes a difference to people's everyday lives. The cost of a bus ticket, how safe is the money in your bank account, how much EMI you have to pay when you take a home loan, or what interest rate is charged when you raise a loan to send your daughter or son abroad for higher education – all these and more depend on RBI policies and actions.


**Dr. Duvvuri Subbarao who was Governor of RBI during 2008-13 will speak on how RBI makes a difference to people's everyday lives.** Subbarao served as Governor of the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) for five years (2008-13). Prior to that, he was Finance Secretary to the Government of India (2007-08) and Secretary to the Prime Minister's Economic Advisory Council (2005-07). He was a Lead Economist in the World Bank ((1999 - 2004) where his responsibilities involved advising developing countries on public finance management. Subbarao studied at the Indian Institute of Technology, Kanpur. He went to Graduate School at Ohio State University and later was a Humphrey Fellow at MIT studying Public Finance. He obtained his doctorate in public finance from Andhra University. **Subbarao's' recent book "Just a Mercenary?" is the winner of the Crossword Book Awards 2025 - Jury Award for Business and Management category.**

## HOW DO HISTORIANS PERIODIZE THE PAST?

Historians periodize the past into distinct phases which facilitate easier analysis of events and historical processes. Indian historiography is known for its tripartite scheme of periodization, “identified rather artlessly” as the ancient, the medieval and the modern. Institutions such as the NCERT, UGC , universities and the Indian History Congress follow this tripartite scheme. In recent decades, attempts have been made to redesignate some of these periods and introduce additional ones such as the early medieval and the early modern. How do historians arrive at these schemes of periodization?

**This lecture will explain the rationale behind this practice and reflect upon its limitations in producing historical knowledge. Award-winning historian Manu V. Devadevan, Associate Professor of History, School of Humanities and Social Sciences, Indian Institute of Technology, Mandi, Himachal Pradesh, will deliver the IWA Annual Endowment lecture** organized in association with the Madras Museum.

A polygot, Dr. Devadevan is the recipient of the prestigious Infosys Prize, 2019. *“In studies ranging from Pallava kingship, Kudiyyattam theatre, the history of mathematics and astronomy in India, the Jagannatha temple in Puri, and above all the masterly A Prehistory of Hinduism (2016), Devadevan has offered a revisionist paradigm for the study of pre-modern India”,* says the Infosys citation.

He is the author of well-known books, including The ‘ Early Medieval’ Origins of India (2020). He has published scholarly works in both Kannada and English.

The meeting begins at **10.45 am**. We request everyone to be seated by **10.30 am**. **Guests are most welcome.**
